

# GUIDANCE FOR OWNERS/VENDORS

## 1. Vices & Unusual Behaviour

It is the responsibility of the Owner/Vendor of a Lot that any vice or unusual behaviour is noted on the vendors warranty and to ensure that it is announced from the auctioneer's rostrum. The vendors warranty will be regarded as a legal document where there is a dispute.

## 2. Turnout of Animals and Handlers/Riders

Remember Good Presentation of Animals (and Handlers/Riders) is a major benefit to the sale of a Lot and first impressions are lasting!

## 3. Pedigree

If the pedigree of a Lot is recorded in the catalogue but is not documented in the passport this must be brought to the attention of the office immediately

## 4. Reserve/Price

We strongly advise all Owners to have carefully thought and be realistic about the reserve price prior to entering the auctioneer's rostrum.

## 5. Release of Horses

A pass-out must be obtained from the main office prior to an animal being removed from the complex.

## 6. Private Sales

Where a horse is unsold in the sales ring and a Purchaser agrees a price with the Vendor, with or without the assistance of an agent of Cavan Equestrian Centre, this transaction must be completed and signed for with the agent of Cavan Equestrian Centre or in the main office.

Any horse purchased that is not transacted through the Auctioneers of Cavan Equestrian Centre the Vendor will be barred from participating in all future sales.
